**STARKE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION HOSTS
THIRD ANNUAL MANUFACTURERS DAY EVENT**

Starke County, Indiana, October 1, 2015 – How much do you know about the successful industries and opportunities available in our own local communities? The Starke County Economic Development Foundation (SCEDF) will host its 3rd Annual Manufacturers Day and Prospectus & Achievement Event on Thursday, October 8, 2015, at the Knox Middle School. This year's event will spotlight many of our local industries including: American Oak, Elkay Manufacturing Company, Hoosier Custom Plastics, LLC, I.P. Callison & Sons, J.W. Hicks, Johnny On-The-Spot, Kemin Industries, Knox Fertilizer Company, Kruz, Inc., MPI Products LLC, Metro Recycling, Norton Packaging, Inc., Selected Furniture LLC, Thermo Products, LLC, Toll Integrated Systems, Traffic Control Specialists, Inc., WestRock Company, and White Flyer Targets. Starke County Initiative for Lifelong Learning (SCILL) will also be highlighted at this year's event.

SCEDF partners each year with Oregon-Davis, Knox, and North Judson-San Pierre school corporations and this year will also partner with Culver Community Schools. Approximately 340 seventh grade students from those school corporations will visit the companies' displays to learn what they manufacture or what services they provide, the skills and training required for each job at the company, and the kinds of jobs they have. Each company display will be manned by a representative to explain and answer questions.

The goal of the program for the students is to make sure they are aware of what is available in their own community, and the skills and education needed for them to be able to work for one of these companies. The seventh grade was chosen as the best age in which to present this program, as what they learn can be used the following year when they start preparing their

high school schedule of classes. With knowledge of what is at stake, it is hoped that students properly prepare for their future, whether it be college or a vocational program.

The Foundation is using this event, in part, as a way to answer industry's cries for help in finding workers with proper job skills, and at the same time, engaging students in what opportunities their home communities can offer if they have the skills employers need. According to Foundation Executive Director, Charles Weaver, "We are excited to have this opportunity to showcase our local industry. We hope this event will make what they do here more readily apparent to people in the county and surrounding areas, and in this case, especially to the seventh graders who will someday be working for these companies."

The public is invited and encouraged to visit the industries booths from 12:45 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. in the auxiliary gym of the Knox Middle School. Patrons please enter through Door #8.

Visitors will gain knowledge as to what each organization actually executes in daily operations, job opportunities available inside participating organizations, and what qualifications or education they must attain to adequately complete their tasks in different skilled positions. Also, participants will learn first-hand what each employer looks for in possible candidates for employment in their organization. As a result, the event will allow participants to start taking fundamental steps towards securing a job in some area of skilled labor, thus, promoting long-term economic sustainability in Starke County and surrounding areas.

As part of the day's events, a prospectus luncheon will be held to highlight this year's happenings and accomplishments at the Foundation and to present the annual Robert E. Hamilton Award, an annual award that is named in honor of the Starke County banker who was instrumental in the creation of the Foundation, that is awarded to a person who has contributed greatly to economic development in Starke County, Indiana.
